Dunkerton Jr. High Boys' Track and Field

The Raider Jr. High boys accomplished many goals in their 2012 track season. This group of boys set several Dunkerton Jr. High records and won a total of three meets. They were the first Raider boys' team to win the Iowa Star Conference at the Jr. High level. They broke six of the seven standing relay records and four individual records. Johnny Davis broke the 100 m dash, 200 m dash, and 800 m run records this year. Aric Russell set the record in the 10 flight hurdles.

Additionally, these boys were given the opportunity to com-

pete in the Mike Henderson Track and Field State Meet. The meet took place in Granger, Iowa and was an all-day event. The state meet was divided into grade and class size. We competed in the small class division for both seventh and eighth grade. In order to medal you had to place in the top six. The seventh grade Distance Medley and 4x100 relays both received medals. Collin Conger also received a medal taking fourth place in the 200 m hurdles. The eighth grade medaled in the 4x400 and Johnny Davis took second in the 400 m dash.

Dunkerton also had four boys

participate in the local Hershey Track and Field Games. The Hershey Games is a series of four track meets where only the winner advances. There is a local, state, regional and national meet for the Hershey Games. All the Jr. High contestants competed at the 13 and 14 age category. All four boys that competed for Dunkerton ended up advancing to the state meet. Tim Schares won the softball throw; Jordan Yessak in the 1600 m run; Will

Brown in the 800 m run; Johnny Davis in the 100 m dash, 200 m dash, and the standing long jump.

Thank you to all the parents, family, and track participants that helped make this a very successful and fun season.

In an effort to join the battle against childhood cancer, Dunkerton 4-Hers will host an Alex's Lemonade Stand during Dunkerton's citywide garage sales. Members of the group have hosted the stand two years already, earning over \$1,200 for ALSF. Our goal this year is to add another \$500 to that total – we need the help of our community to reach this goal!

Alex's Lemonade Stand Foundation (ALSF) emerged from the front yard lemonade stand of cancer patient Alexandra "Alex" Scott (1996-2004). In 2000, 4-year-old Alex announced that she wanted to hold a lemonade stand to raise money to help find a cure for all children with cancer. Since Alex held that first stand, the Foundation bearing her name has evolved into a national fundraising movement, complete with thousands of supporters across the country carrying on her legacy of hope. To date, Alex's Lemonade Stand Foundation, a registered 501(c) 3 charity, has raised more than \$50 million toward fulfilling Alex's dream of finding a cure, funding over 200 research projects nationally.






