### New Polling Place for Barclay/ Lester/ Dunkerton Voters

Voters of Barclay and Lester townships and the City of Dunkerton will be voting in a new location November 6, 2012 and for future elections. Combined, these communities have 1,407 registered voters and the new location will provide additional space for the voting process.

First Baptist Church, 101 Sycamore Street, Dunkerton will serve as the new polling place location for voters of Barclay, Lester and Dunkerton. All registered voters will be notified of this change by postcard and questions may be directed to the Election Department at 833-3007. ## Thank You Taxpayers & New Crosswalk

I get a lot of calls every day. Some are important, some are people trying to sell me something, and others are people with really good ideas. I got one the other day with a really good idea; "Thank the taxpayers for their support of the school." The more I thought about it, the better I liked it. So, on behalf of all the students, staff, and community members we would like to extend a huge THANK YOU to all of those taxpayers out there that are supporting the school. Without you, we would not exist, and that deserves a "thank you"!

Several years ago (2007 or 2008) the IDOT came up with a plan to move the crosswalk at the school to a safer location. The plan was put on a temporary hold while the new water mains were placed along Highway 281. Once that project was completed, the plan was once again put on a temporary hold while the new school was being constructed. At that point it was somewhat forgotten until it came up at a Board Meeting one night. One thing led to another, and before you knew it, the IDOT, City of Dunkerton, and Dunkerton Community Schools were meeting to plan the move of the crosswalk. The crosswalk will be moved to a location that is South of the current crosswalk. The DOT is going to supply signs and a solar powered flashing light to be placed as a warning ahead of the crosswalk, and once installed they will become the property of the City. The school will be replacing the sidewalk

on the East side of Highway 281 from the school property line to the new crosswalk. The school will also be placing student assistance at the old and new crosswalks to help guide the children to the new crosswalk area until this change becomes familiar with the students. We will also have the teachers and students visit the area to explain to the students about the change. We will be closing the North entrance to the student/spectator parking lot as an added safety measure for the students. We will start using the new crosswalk once the signs are installed and the new sidewalk is in place. We will continue to use the rollout stop sign at the new location. Our hope is that these changes will make the school crosswalk a safer route to school for our students.

Thank you again for helping to make Dunkerton a great place to live, and Dunkerton Schools a great place to be a kid!!!

All blood types are needed to ensure a reliable supply for patients. A blood donor can or driver's license or two other forms of identification are required at check-in. Individuals who are 17 years of age, weigh at least 110 pounds and are in generally good health maybe eligible to donate blood. High school students and other donors 18 years of age and younger also have to meet certain height and weight requirements.

# Blue Zones

Did you enjoy finding your stress-relief strategy last time? I discovered that time outdoors does wonders for me! This week I want to focus on the fourth healthy habit from the Power 9™: move naturally, know your purpose, down shift, 80% rule, plant slant, wine at 5, family first, belong, right tribe.

According to Blue Zones Project, we should stop eating when our stomach feels 80% full. This 20% gap between not being hungry and feeling full could be the difference between losing weight or gaining it. We can also replace our big tableware with 10" plates and tall, skinny glasses, remove any TV's from the kitchen, and remember that people in the Blue Zones® areas eat their smallest meal in the late afternoon or early evening and then

don't eat any more the rest of the day.

Did you just read a lot of areas for improvement like I did? I have noticed that I do better stopping at 80% if I plate my food and then sit at the table. Speaking of plates, I have also noticed that I eat less when I use the salad plates for my dinner. If you drink water like I do, I think we can keep the big glasses. Now I get stuck in the other Blue Zones recommendations: no TV in the kitchen, a small dinner, no eating after dinner. I have a TV close to the kitchen for entertainment while I cook, although I usually turn it off when we eat. If I made dinner smaller, I feel like I would want even more food later. Any ideas how to make it from dinner to bedtime without food? . . . Stay tuned next time for a look at healthy habit number five – plant slant.

During the final 3 innings of the 5 inning contest Laura and her batterymate were called into action when the 2010 alum went down with a

sore arm. For the next 3 innings Laura struck out 5, pitched 1 hit shutout ball, and secured a 2-0 win for the old timers. What is even more remarkable is that she had participated in a 10 mile run in Minneapolis the night before.

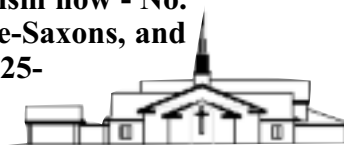

## ID Scanners Available in Some Voting Precincts; Cell Phone Voter Registration Not Valid

News release

Modern technology is a big part of elections these days, but some things still have to be done the old-fashioned way. The County Auditor's Office is reminding voters that ID scanners will be available in some precincts on General Election Day, November 6, but also warning that voter registration can't be accomplished from your cell phone.

County Auditor Grant Veeder said barcode scanners – giving voters the option of using a driver's license or voter identification card to expedite the voting process – will be available in twenty-eight of the county's voting precincts.

"The scanners read the barcode on a voter identification card or on the back of the

voter's driver's license in order to search for and select the correct voter," Veeder said. "The process is fast and accurate, but it is the voter's choice whether to use the scanner.

"In the precincts where it is available, voters who don't have these forms of identification with them or choose not to use them will have their names typed into the electronic poll-book system the same way it has been done in previous elections," he added.

The scanner will also work with a nondriver ID card from the Iowa Department of Transportation.

The system is only available in the precincts where the Precinct Atlas electronic poll-book equipment is used. A list of those precincts can be found

online at the county's website, [www.co.black-hawk.ia.us](http://www.co.black-hawk.ia.us).

Meanwhile, a new cell phone app appears to allow people to register to vote from their mobile devices, creating a facsimile of the prospective voter's signature. However, an original signature is still required.

"We can't accept voter registrations or absentee ballot applications electronically, and the forms that we receive must, per the Iowa Code, have original signatures," said County Auditor Grant Veeder. He said there are exceptions for voters in the military or civilians living overseas.

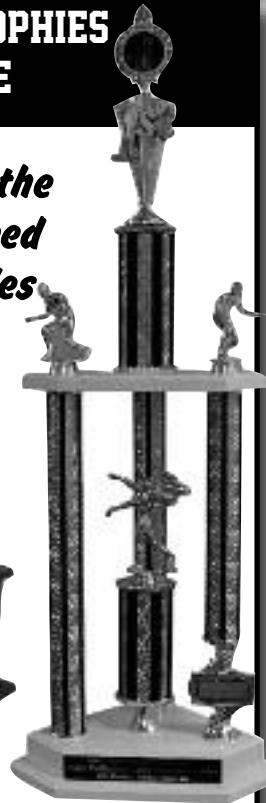
